HUD Deputy Secretary **Pamela Hughes Patenaude** brings more than 30 years of experience in the areas of housing, economic development, real estate, and public policy. Prior to joining HUD, she served as the President of the J. Ronald Terwilliger Foundation for Housing America's Families, a national nonprofit education and research organization dedicated to illuminating America's affordable housing crisis. Before co-founding the Terwilliger Foundation, she was the Director of

Housing Policy for the Bipartisan Policy Center and served as Executive Vice President of the Urban Land Institute and Founding Executive Director of the ULI Terwilliger Center for Workforce Housing. Earlier in her career, Pamela served as Assistant Secretary for Community Planning and Development at HUD. Prior to her work at CPD, she served HUD as the Assistant Deputy Secretary for Field Policy and Management. Pamela holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Saint Anselm College and a Master of Science degree in Community Economic Development from Southern New Hampshire University.



Mary M. Lee is a Deputy Director at PolicyLink, a national advocacy organization working to advance racial and economic equity. She helps guide PolicyLink efforts related to health and community development, and provides technical assistance and training to public and private agencies collaborating to build healthy and equitable communities. A

graduate of Boalt Hall School of Law, University of California, Berkeley, Mary is a practicing attorney with more than 25 years of experience using civil rights, land use, and economic development strategies to revitalize neighborhoods and enhance public participation in the policy arena. At PolicyLink, she has co-authored reports on access to healthy food, the built environment, and the impact of place and race on health. She also teaches courses on law, public policy, and civil rights. Mary is a member of the Los Angeles Food Policy Council, and a board member of the Community Coalition.



Barbara Matheson Fox is Freddie Mac's Vice President of Government Affairs. Barbara spearheads the corporation's interactions with federal and congressional policymakers. Barbara is responsible for developing and implementing public policy issues of importance to Freddie Mac. Barbara's 37-year tenure at Freddie Mac has included a wide range of

Ali Solis is President and CEO of Make Room, Inc., a national advocacy nonprofit organization giving voice to America's struggling renters. She works closely with the White House, U.S. Congress, state and local policy leaders and industry stakeholders to advance solutions that address rental housing affordability. Ali recently gained bipartisan support for legislation that

commemorates September as the National Month for Renters. During her career in housing, she has led successful national and local campaigns through multi-sector coalitions that mobilize for action. An INROADS alumnus and University of Maryland graduate, Ali was previously the Senior Vice President, Public Policy and Corporate Affairs Executive for Enterprise Community Partners, Inc. where she was the chief external affairs officer responsible for government affairs, policy development, research, communications and business development.



Marion Mollegen McFadden serves as vice president of public policy at Enterprise, leading research and advocacy to support affordable housing and community development. Last year Enterprise's policy team successfully led the nation's efforts to preserve the Low Income Housing Tax Credit in tax reform and this year saw advocacy efforts culminate in the first expansion of the Housing Credit in ten years and a 10%

increase to HUD budget. Previously, Marion served as deputy assistant secretary for Grant Programs at the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Housing (HUD), where she oversaw the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG), the HOME Investment Partnerships program, the Housing Trust Fund, the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) and CDBG Disaster Recovery funds, including the \$1 billion National Disaster Resilience Competition grants. Previously she served as Chief Operating Officer and Acting Executive Director of the interagency Hurricane Sandy Rebuilding Task Force and in multiple positions at the Office of General Counsel at HUD. Marion holds a J.D., *magna cum laude*, from Howard University School of Law and a B.A. from Northwestern University.



Dr. Frank Nothaft is chief economist for CoreLogic, America's largest provider of advanced property and ownership information, analytics and data-enabled services. He leads the economics team responsible for analysis, commentary and forecasting trends in global real estate, insurance and mortgage markets. Before joining CoreLogic, Frank served in a variety of leadership positions with increasing responsibility

at Freddie Mac.
